EMPOWERING FAMILIES

“I have lived in East Nashville my entire life. I was raised by both parents who taught me respect and to strive for success. Throughout my education, I had always made good grades, and nothing could ever stop me, until I felt like it did. My 2nd year at Belmont University I ended up getting pregnant with my first son. I was very sick during my pregnancy and ultimately ended up dropping out of school. After thinking one child would be a challenge, nineteen months later, I had my second son, and my adult life started to feel overwhelming before it began. Dropping out of school has weighed very heavy on my heart because after I signed the paperwork I did not feel like I made the right decision, but I had to focus on the future and start providing for my sons.

I started looking for a better job and I ended up finding a Lead Customer Service Rep job at Fifth Third Bank. I started asking family and friends did they know of any daycares that taught the kids fundamentals and helped with potty training. A cousin told me their daughter attended Fannie Battle and the rest is history. Immediately, after walking into Fannie Battle and meeting the staff, I could feel the warmth and love from everyone. The teachers and administrators exuded compassion for the children, and I had never felt more confident that this would be the place to help the boys get started on their journey.

I heard about the Family Empowerment Program through one of their teachers and was motivated to enroll. Throughout my seven months in the program I have received guidance and support to help me focus on saving and planning my finances. I was also introduced to a program dedicated to helping individuals start their own business and they helped me achieve my educational goals of attending Tennessee College of Applied Technology. I was accepted and begin on September 1st, 2020.

I am so grateful for Fannie Battle for having this program for women like me to attend and get to know other moms that aspire to be successful. This program brings women together to inspire one another and to never give up. FEP has opened doors that may not have been possible if it was not because of their guidance and encouragement. I can finally say I feel achievement in my life and that is all thanks to FEP and Fannie Battle. — Toya Jordan
